### **LEARNING CONFERENCES AND LEARNING GOALS**

All children will require a Learning Conference appointment.

Interviews can now be booked on-line at <a href="www.schoolinterviews.co.nz">www.schoolinterviews.co.nz</a> - The code is <a href="mailto:sqs87">sqs87</a>

Please note that children in Room 6 with Whaea Sari will have their Learning Conferences on Monday 24th March (during the school day) or Tuesday 1st April (3.15 - 7pm). Children can attend the conferences during the school day with their caregiver.

Student Learning Conferences will be held on **Wednesday 9th April (2:15 – 6.45 pm) and Thursday 10th April (2:15 – 6.45 pm).** Booking will again be on-line, and details of how to do this are below.

On both Wednesday 9th April and Thursday 10th April, we will break for lunch from 12.00 - 1.00 and classes will cease at 2.00 pm to allow interviews to begin soon afterwards. Parents are asked to make alternative arrangements for children to go home or be collected at 2.00pm. Primary buses will leave school at 2pm.

We have contacted Busy Bumbles, and they will open from 2.15pm on both of these days to assist parents with childcare. You can contact them on 347-3031 should you wish to book your child into their session.


### Involving children in the conference:

Remember that these conferences are about involving children in their learning. The aim is for students to develop the skills to confidently articulate where they are in their learning, what they need to do next and how best to achieve this. These conferences are not designed to be occasions for parents to discuss sensitive issues or serious behaviour concerns; a separate meeting at the time the issue or concern arises should be arranged with the class teacher for such matters

#### **BOARD BUZZ**

We hope everyone has had a settled start to the year. This is our first Board Buzz for 2025, and it's hard to believe we're already halfway through this term!

Reading, writing and maths......It might be of no surprise that our main focus this year is the rollout of Structured Literacy in our Year 3 to 6 classes, along with the implementation of a structured approach to teaching mathematics.

At the start of the year, our teaching staff were introduced to the fundamentals of the iDeal learning approach (Individualised Diagnostic Explicit Approach to Learning), which we are using to support our Structured Literacy instruction. iDeal is an online learning and resource platform designed to help schools implement a structured literacy approach. This is a significant undertaking for our staff, and we are incredibly proud of the way they have embraced the teaching of iDeal. For our structured approach to mathematics, we have chosen the Numicon programme. All necessary resources have now arrived, and we will begin implementing the programme in Term 2, as our focus this term is on Structured Literacy. This year's major property project is the repainting of our school, which will continue throughout this term and into Term 2. As part of this project, some of the older wooden windows in our middle school classrooms will be replaced with double-glazed aluminium. Work is progressing well.

One exciting event is the Leeston Consolidated School Classic Car Show, happening on Saturday March 29th, from 10 AM to 2 PM.
