Over the past few weeks, our learners and teachers have been busy embedding structured literacy routines and it's a pleasure seeing these lessons in action and the engagement of our tamariki. And as part of the 'Make it Count' programme, the Ministry-funded numicon resources have arrived and we are busy unpacking! This resource is aligned to the refreshed curriculum, and has been funded to support schools while they implement the revised maths and statistics learning areas for years 0-8.

LEARNING CONFERENCES AND LEARNING GOALS

All children will require a Learning Conference appointment.

Interviews can now be booked on-line at www.schoolinterviews.co.nz - The code is sqs87

Please note that children in Room 6 with Whaea Sari will have their Learning Conferences on Monday 24th March (during the school day) or Tuesday 1st April (3.15 - 7pm). Children can attend the conferences during the school day with their caregiver.

Student Learning Conferences will be held on **Wednesday 9th April (2:15 – 6.45 pm) and Thursday 10th April (2:15 – 6.45 pm).** Booking will again be on-line, and details of how to do this are below.

On both Wednesday 9th April and Thursday 10th April, we will break for lunch from 12.00 – 1.00 and classes will cease at 2.00 pm to allow interviews to begin soon afterwards. Parents are asked to make alternative arrangements for children to go home or be collected at 2.00pm. Primary buses will leave school at 2pm.

We have contacted Busy Bumbles, and they will open from 2.15pm on both of these days to assist parents with childcare. You can contact them on 347-3031 should you wish to book your child into their session.

Involving children in the conference:

Remember that these conferences are about involving children in their learning. The aim is for students to develop the skills to confidently articulate where they are in their learning, what they need to do next and how best to achieve this. These conferences are not designed to be occasions for parents to discuss sensitive issues or serious behaviour concerns; a separate meeting at the time the issue or concern arises should be arranged with the class teacher for such matters




CONCERNS AND COMPLAINTS

HEAD LICE

Head Lice are present amongst several classrooms. These insects are a nuisance and can be controlled or eradicated by families. Head Lice crawl from head to head and may be passed on through shared objects such as hairbrushes and hats.

It is recommended that you check all members of your household carefully. Anyone can host headlice. Cleanliness is not a factor in whether head lice are present or not.

What to look for:

- Small light or dark brown insects without wings
- Tiny whitish eggs (nits) like grains of salt attached to hair shafts
- There may be unusual itching on the head or neck
- Small red marks on the neck or behind the ears (head lice bites)

Going overseas for the school holidays? Everyone travelling into New Zealand must complete a New Zealand Traveller Declaration, including returning New Zealand passport holders.

Its FREE and you can do it on the online form or on the NZTD app.

If you're travelling as a family or group and completing multiple declarations, the <u>NZTD app</u> allows you to copy your travel details into another declaration, making it easier to complete multiple declarations for the same journey. The submitted declarations are then all easy to see within the app.

The New Zealand Traveller Declaration collects travel, customs, immigration and biosecurity information and aims to improve the safety and security of New Zealand. It replaces the paper card you used to fill out on the plane. To make your arrival easier, do your digital declaration before your flight back to New Zealand.
